MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL, AECS KAIGA



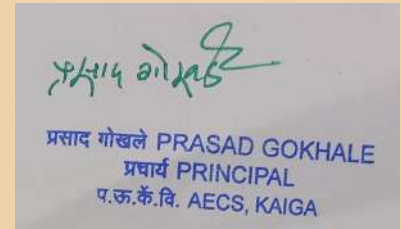

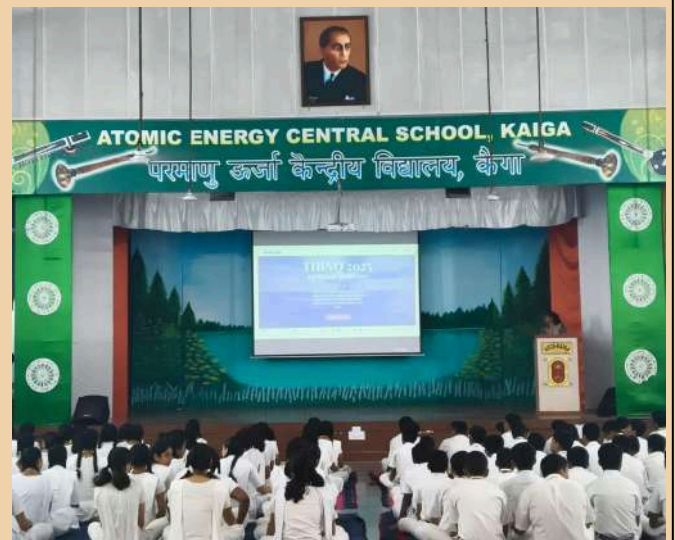


THINQ Exam

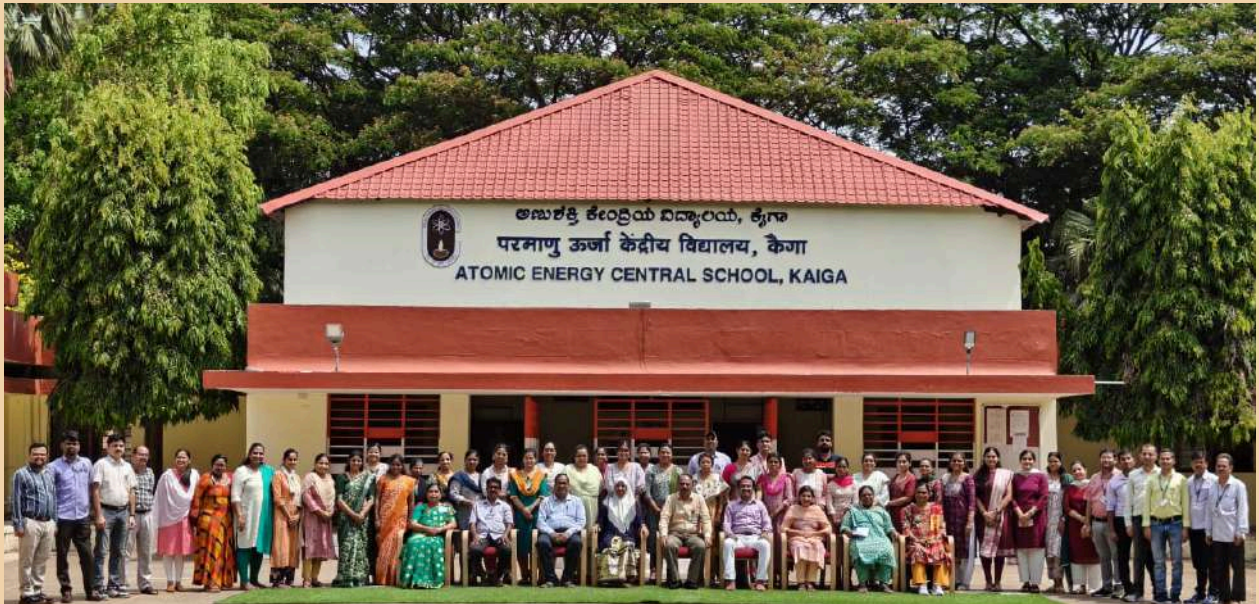
